I never looked at girls the same way again, a real adventure in life. In the early 1940s, my mother would go the store for food, and she would only buy flour, sugar, salt, and pepper. Most everything we ate was farmed raised or baked by Mom. This generation would starve if they had to raise their own food and prepare it (fast food). I had a best friend named Rick he was like a brother to me called him my partner. We were in the gold mining business. We were very successful in finding gold. Forty great years of fun and adventures in life with him. I have had many adventures in my life. I tried to write about a few of them. Everybody has a book in their life experiences. They just don't have it written down on paper. The author tells of his growing up in the spectacular mountains of Colorado on the Two-Bar Ranch.
